Full scholarships are available through the Maryland Works for Wind grant for the following skilled trades trainings.



Advanced Welding: 6G Pipe

Become proficient in pipe welding with this 80-hour evening course and pass the 6G ASME Section IX Stick and TIG welder qualification exams. At least two years of welding experience is required. This course meets four hours per night, two nights per week.



Construction Academy

Become a proficient carpenter through this 13-week course. First Aid/CPR/AED, OSHA 10, Rigging, Fall Safe and Confined Space certifications may be earned. This course meets four hours per day, five days per week.



Powerline Worker Pre-Apprenticeship (PWPA) with CDL

Prepare to work in the powerline worker industry with 13 weeks of hands-on training followed by eight weeks of commercial driver training. OSHA 10, First Aid/CPR/AED, ATSSA traffic controller certifications and MD CDL may be earned. The PWPA program meets eight hours per day, five days per week and the CDL program runs 10 hours per day, four days per week.

There is an application and selection process for the above trainings. Students have an opportunity to meet with local businesses at the end of the course.



Air Conditioning & Refrigeration - Introduction II

Focus is on the proper handling of refrigerants, how to solder, flare and swag, and troubleshooting procedures. Students passing the EPA Types I, II and III exam on the last night of class will earn their universal license. Prerequisite: "Air Conditioning and Refrigeration-Introduction I." This course meets three hours per night once a week for 12 weeks.

Wanted: welders, machinists & metal fabricators



Train for a career with a skill that is in high demand—for free!

Through an ongoing partnership with Quality Staffing Services, Wor-Wic Community College is offering free welding and machining and metal fabrication training for eligible and chosen applicants.

Welding

Become proficient in welding to the AWS D1.1 standard in this 352-hour program that runs for 18 weeks from 8 a.m.-noon, Monday through Friday. Students learn to weld proficiently using four processes (shielded metal arc welding, flux-core arc welding, gas metal arc welding and gas tungsten arc welding) and in three positions (2G, 3G and 4G). They also attend field trips to local companies, and may earn up to 12 welding qualifications during this short, less than five-month program. Some successful students are even hired prior to graduation.

Machining & Metal Fabricating

Become skilled with measuring, layout, forming, cutting and assembling metal pieces utilizing proper equipment and machines, then learn the basics for welding the pieces together. This 228-hour program runs for 19 weeks from 5-9 p.m. during Monday, Wednesday and Friday evenings. Students attend field trips to local companies and may earn an OSHA certification during this short, less than five-month, program. Some successful students are even hired prior to graduation.
