WHO MAY APPLY: OPEN TO MDARNG AGR WARRANT OFFICERS WHO HAVE COMPLETED A MINIMUM OF 18 MONTHS OF THEIR INITIAL TOUR AND TRADITIONAL WARRANT OFFICERS OF THE MARYLAND ARMY NATIONAL GUARD ONLY.

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Must be in a Ready Reserve status. 2. Must be a member of the Maryland Army national Guard. 3. Must not be under current suspension of favorable personnel actions. 4. Must not be entitled to receive Federal military retired or retainer pay. 5. Must be able to complete a 3-year initial tour of AD or FTNGD prior to completing 18 years of active service and before MRD. 6. Applicants who have voluntarily separated from the AGR Program are not eligible to re-enter for one year from date of separation. 7. Applicants who have voluntarily separated from the AGR Program in lieu of adverse personnel actions, or who have been involuntarily separated from the AGR Program are not eligible to re-enter the program. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Must possess the qualifications prescribed in Table 2-1 and not be disqualified under Tables 2-2 or 2-3 IAW AR 135-18. 2. Must be medically certified as drug free and be tested negative for HIV within the last 24 months prior to initial entry. 4. Must meet the body composition standards prescribed in AR 600-9. 5. Must meet the medical fitness standards for retention per AR 40-501, chapter 3; PHA or flight physical must be within 12 months prior to initial entry. Soldiers whose PULHES contains a "3" or "4" must meet the requirements of AR 600-60 prior to initial entry. 6. Must be able to complete the Military Education requirements commensurate with the military grade. 7. Must be a qualified and current UH-60 pilot. 8. Must have a minimum of 500 hours in a military rotary aircraft. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Must possess the qualifications prescribed in Table 2-4 and not be disqualified under Tables 2-5 or 2-6 IAW AR 135-18. 2. Must possess MOS of the AGR duty position or become qualified in that AOC within 12 months. 3. Failure to qualify in AGR duty position MOS within 12 months of assignment will result in mandatory separation from the AGR Program per Chapter 6, NGR 600-5. 4. Must be within grade requirements of MTOE/TDA position and NGB staffing Guide. 5. Warrant Officers who have not completed a minimum of 18 months of their initial tour may request a waiver of the 18 months stabilization rule through their current Command to be approved by the Chief of Staff (CoS). 6. Stabilization Rule waiver consists of: Letter from Soldier, Endorsements from Chain of Command (CoC), SF 52 w/Executive Summary from Command, and original application packet. 7. A copy of the complete Stabilization Rule waiver along with a copy of the application must reach HRO prior to closing date of the announcement; originals must reach the CoS office prior to the closing date of the announcement.

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DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: MOS 153D/I The aviation mission survivability officer (AMSO) is the primary advisor to the commander, staff, aircrews, and planners on survivability issues and aviation tactics. This includes TTP, electronic warfare (EW), aircraft survivability equipment (ASE), intelligence, and survival resources during training and operations in order to facilitate information flow, enhance survivability of organic aircrew and equipment, and mission success. AMSOs are responsible for the following: Assisting the commander as the primary advisor for aviation mission survivability (AMS), Maintaining a high level of aircraft and tactical proficiency as a pilot in command. Emphasis should be placed on also becoming qualified as a flight lead, air mission commander (AMC), and a unit trainer (UT), straining and administering the commander's AMS program. The AMSO assists the commander in integrating threat versus aircraft survivability mission planning, formulating, and disseminating TTP, and training crew, small team and collective scenarios as part of the commander's ATP and unit mission, serving as the unit personnel recovery officer, serves as Aviation Tactical Instructor Pilot, assist as a Flight Operations Officer, and performs other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED: Applicant must be 153D MOS Qualified with ability to obtain "I" SQI. Must have a minimum of 500 hours of military rotary flight time. Must be a Pilot in Command or able to obtain pilot in command within 6 months of hire. Must be a qualified AMSO or be qualified within 12 months of hire. All applicants must possess a current DD 2992 "Medical Recommendation for Flying or Special Operations Duty". Army aviators must have a SECRET security clearance. Applicants must have a valid state driver's license and be able to operate military vehicles and equipment organic to the unit. Applicant must be qualified for appointment in the position. Applicant must be able to complete the Military Educational requirements commensurate with their military grade. Applicants must not have any flagging actions that would prevent them from applying.

SPECIAL INFORMATION

1. Appropriate military uniform will be worn during duty hours.
2. Continuation of tour is subject to findings of the AGR Tour Continuation Board and the Adjutant General.
3. Initial Tour AGR soldiers who do not become MOS/AOC qualified within 12 months will be reassigned to a position for which they are qualified or be separated from the AGR program.
4. Except for mobilization or other emergency, member accepted for tour normally will not be subject to reassignment during the first 18 months of initial tour. After 18 months of initial tour, soldier may be reassigned without consent or without geographical limitations to meet the needs of the service.
5. As a condition of employment, service members are required to attend mandatory PEC training courses associated with their FTS positions. Failure to complete course(s) at PEC within the first year of employment may be cause for reassignment to other FT positions or termination from employment.
6. Must sign a Certificate of Agreement and Understanding prior to being ordered to AGR duty.
